

MUSIC EDUCATION TRANSFORMS

2022-2023 IMPACT REPORT

At Play On Philly (POP), we believe in the power of music education to develop and inspire the behaviors and personal skills needed for a successful life. Every year, POP provides underserved children in Philadelphia **over 400 hours** of transformative music education. Students range from pre-Kindergarten to 12th grade and are loaned an orchestral instrument at no cost. Music education makes a quantifiable difference in a child's life, and we have the data to prove it. **POP students earn 10 points higher on standardized tests** than their peers; they score higher on English Language Arts and math tests; they have increased study skills; they demonstrate better executive functioning skills like determination and focus.



2022–2023 HIGHLIGHTS & ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Whether you attended a concert, shared a post, or made a gift to POP, you played an instrumental role in helping our students achieve new heights of musical excellence.

- The POP Children's Orchestra expanded thanks to the addition of two new double bass studios at our Independence Charter School West and St. Rose of Lima School Music Centers.
- POP launched the Composing for Young Orchestras Project in collaboration with the Gabriela Lena Frank Creative Academy of Music (GLFCAM). Diverse emerging composers from GLFCAM engaged with students at in-person and virtual visits this year to get a sense of their musical experiences and discussed ideas for the commissioned pieces.
- POP string players had a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to learn from world-class violinists Noah Bendix-Balgley, concertmaster of the Berlin Philharmonic, and Shanshan Yao, concert violinist and former member of the New York Philharmonic.
- In spring 2023, POP students participated in Young At Art, a collaborative performance in partnership with Astral Artists and BalletX that celebrated the dance music of Latin America and Latinx composers.



Students, alumni, and Teaching Artists came together with guest artists **Canadian Brass** for a special performance at our 2023 Evening of Harmony to celebrate our Founder **Stanford Thompson**. Nearly 500 community members and supporters attended.

MEET VIOLIST JANELL



THE INAUGURAL YEAR OF THE MARIAN ANDERSON YOUNG ARTIST PROGRAM

Your support this year provided a transformative music education experience for young people and helped them build confidence to pursue their dreams. For some of our young people, that dream happens to be pursuing a career in music. This year marked the inaugural year of POP's **Marian Anderson Young Artist Program**, which provides tuition-free support to rising young classical and jazz musicians and vocalists in Philadelphia through private lessons, solo and ensemble performance, and college and career advisement. Musicians are placed in two tracks: the apprentice track is for younger musicians who have shown interest in furthering their musical skills, while the scholar track is for high school musicians who want to pursue a career in music and audition for a music-focused college program.

2022–2023 ANDERSON ARTIST ACTIVITIES

- Our rising musicians honed their performance skills in three "Try It Out" Masterclasses with world-class musicians, including former LA Philharmonic violinist Mitchell Newman, Rowan University's Dr. Joseph Higgins, and Curtis Institute's Paul Bryan.
- Anderson Scholars traveled to Baltimore for a college visit at the Peabody Institute of Johns Hopkins University.
- Anderson Artists performed solo repertoire for friends and family at two Honors Recitals at **Temple University**.

2022-2023 ANDERSON ARTIST ACHIEVEMENTS

- 7 Anderson Artists participated in intensive summer music programs across the country including the LA Philharmonic's YOLA National Festival, National Seminario Ravinia in Chicago, Brevard's Piano Institute in North Carolina, and Berklee School of Music in Massachusetts.
- Jazz Guitarist Andre ^ was chosen as the music category winner in the Zeta lota lota Philly Chapter's Talent Hunt Competition in March 2023.
- Clarinetist Zakyya ^ opened Philadelphia Chamber Music Society's community concert at Alain Locke School for the internationally acclaimed chamber ensemble Imani Winds.
- **Tuba player Keith** ^ was appointed as first tuba of the All City Orchestra and District Band/Orchestra's 2023 spring festivals.
- Harpist Chloé * competed in the Philadelphia Chapter of the American Harp Society in April 2023 and placed 2nd in her division.



2022-2023 ALUMNI HIGHLIGHTS

- POP alumna and flutist **Sophia Radford** (class of 2019) graduated from Temple University with her Bachelor's in Music Education where she studied flute with Dr. Anna Meyer, POP's Anderson Artist Manager.
- POP alumna Christina Rooks (class of 2019) returned as a POP Summer Intern for our 2023 Summer Program.
- POP alum Zebadiah Coombs (class of 2014) became the in-school Music Teacher at St. Francis de Sales School in addition to their role as Viola Teaching Artist with POP.
- POP Alumni Nazir Ebo (class of 2014) has become a successful jazz musician in Philadelphia and will be debuting his first album later this year. Nazir is also the private teacher of Anderson Scholar and jazz drummer Andrew.
